

Train travel to Penrith is operated by Avanti West Coast, with tickets available online and via the Avanti West Coast app, as well as through third party operators.

Stagecoach bus tickets are available to purchase online, via the Stagecoach app, and on board the bus.

- Penrith the North Lakes station can be reached via direct services from major destinations including London, Birmingham and Glasgow.
- Keswick can be reached by bus on the Stagecoach X4 and X5 services.





DAY 1 Keswick

Lakeland market town of Keswick is known for its beautiful location and bustling charm. Popular with visitors looking to enjoy food and drink, culture, shopping and the great outdoors, it is a great place to base yourself.

Keswick Museum Station Rd, Keswick CA12 4NF

Learn more about Keswick and the local area at this award-winning museum, located in the picturesque Fitz Park. Explore ongoing and special exhibitions, visit the community gallery, and keep an eye out for talks and events. There are kids activity trails to keep younger visitors entertained.



Theatre by the Lake Lakeside, Lake Rd, Keswick CA12 5DJ

With its waterfront location and packed programme, Theatre by the Lake is a great place to catch a show. It's home to two stages: the larger Main House, and the more intimate Studio Theatre. Visiting companies and touring works can be found on the calendar, alongside homegrown productions including classic, modern and new plays. If you're visiting at Christmas, don't miss the theatre's festive family show.

DAY 2

Explore the local area, including summer bus connections to Whinlatter

Puzzling Place

Filled with optical illusions, there's something to entertain all ages at the Puzzling Place World of Illusion. From an 'anti-gravity room' to a 'hologram gallery', prepare to be surprised.



Take a hike

Whether you're a beginner looking for an easy route, or an experienced hiker ticking off the Wainwrights, there's a walk for all to enjoy. Many can be reached by foot from Keswick, including Latrigg, Cat Bells and Walla Crag. The Keswick to Threlkeld Railway Trail is an accessible trail which can be enjoyed by a range of users, including trampers and pushchairs.

Ticket office: Launch Co., Derwentwater Foreshore, Keswick CA12 5DJ

Travelling by boat is a great way to see Derwentwater. The Keswick Launch offers boat trips which stop at eight jetties along the way including Ashness Gate (a short walk from the picturesque Ashness Bridge, and popular photo spot Surprise View), Hawes End (for the main walk to Catbells, or a 20-minute walk to the Lingholm Estate). If you're pushed for time, stay on board and take the 50-minute round boat trip.

And in the Summer...

The seasonal Honister Rambler (77/77A) bus service runs along a scenic route, taking in lakes and mountains. Beginning and ending in Keswick, the circular route stops at popular sights and attractions including:



Whinlatter Forest Whinlatter Pass, Keswick CA12 5TW

England's only true mountain forest, Whinlatter is home to signposted hiking and biking trails (bike hire is available on site), with some paths accessible for trampers too. You'll also find a Go Ape treetop adventure course; Visitor Centre; Cafe Ambio and Gruffalo Sculptures in the forest.



TOP TIP: Don't miss the panoramic viewpoint on the WOW (Wonders of Whinlatter) trail, with views across Bassenthwaite and Skiddaw. **TOP TIP:** Check the Stagecoach timetable before travelling, as route dates and times may vary.

Honister Slate Mine Honister Pass, Keswick CA12 5XN

Set within England's last working slate mine, Honister offers a range of unmissable adventure activities - from family-friendly mine tours to the thrilling Via Ferrata. Don't miss the breathtaking infinity bridge: standing 1,000 above the Borrowdale Valley, it's not for the faint hearted!

DAY 3

Cockermouth

Next stop is the pretty Georgian town of Cockermouth, which buzzes with independent shops and foodie treats. Along the way, you'll find attractions to suit all ages - from an award winning distillery to family friendly animal adventures.

Wordsworth House Main St, Cockermouth CA13 9RX

One of the world's best-known poets and a pivotal figure in the global conservation movement, William Wordsworth was born in Cockermouth in 1770. His childhood home, Wordsworth House, is now managed by the National Trust and is open to visitors, who can step back in time and enjoy the world through his eyes.

Lake District WIIdlife Park Bassenthwaite, Keswick CA12 4RD

Take a walk on the wild side: set across 24 acres of parkland, the Lake District Wildlife Park is home to over 100 species of animals including lemurs, zebra and otters. With the backdrop of the Skiddaw massif, it's a unique place to learn more about our planet's wildlife.


